DISTANCE LEARNING ATPL THEORY

SKYWORX® is Skyborne's bespoke online learning platform. The combination of iPad and Computer-Based Training technology, integrated with practical experience on aircraft and simulators, is Skyborne's Progressive Continuous Learning (PCL) approach; all delivered by expert instructors.

What are the pre-entry requirements?

- Be 18 years of age at the time of course commencement
- Hold a PPL(A) issued in accordance with current legislations and current UK CAA publications
- Hold a valid UK CAA Class 2 Medical Certificate
- Be fluent in English and non-native English speakers must achieve a minimum of IELTS 5.5 (academic)

How long does the course take to complete?

The Distance Learning ATPL Theory is flexible. The full-time equivalent is 7 months, but in practice, it can take between 12-24 months to complete.

Where will I train?

Training will take place online, with 12 hours of self-study per week and 3 weeks of exam preparation at Gloucestershire Airport, HQ of Skyborne Airline Academy.

ATPL THEORY

The classroom based ATPL Theory provides you with 767 hours of instructor-led sessions, using the latest technology in state of the art facilities.

What are the pre-entry requirements?

- Be 18 years of age at the time of course commencement
- Hold a PPL(A) issued in accordance with current legislations and current UK CAA publications
- Hold a valid UK CAA Class 2 Medical Certificate
- Be fluent in English and non-native English speakers must achieve a minimum of IELTS 5.5 (academic)

How long does the course take to complete?

The ATPL Theory typically takes 7 months to complete.

MULTI-ENGINE PISTON CLASS RATING (MEP CLASS RATING)

At Skyborne, Commercial Pilot Licence (CPL) and Instrument Rating (IR) training are taught on a Diamond DA-42 Multi-Engine Piston aircraft, therefore it is essential all our pilots complete the MEP Class Rating on the DA-42 prior to the commencement of a Commercial Pilots Licence.

What are the pre-entry requirements?

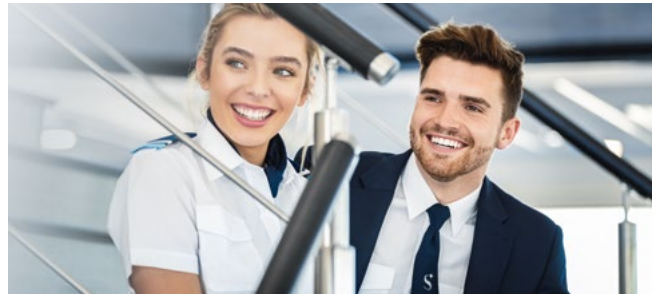
- Hold a PPL(A) issued in accordance with current legislations and current UK CAA publications
- Hold a valid Class 1 Medical Certificate

How long does the course take to complete?

The MEP class rating typically takes two weeks to complete.

COMMERCIAL PILOT LICENCE (CPL)

A Commercial Pilot Licence is a requirement set by the International Civil Aviation Organisation for an individual to receive payment for flying an aircraft.

What are the pre-entry requirements?

- Hold a PPL(A) issued in accordance with current legislations and current UK CAA publications
- Have completed 169 flying hours
- Comply with the prerequisites for the issues of a class or type rating for multi-engine aeroplanes in accordance with current legislation and current UK CAA publications, if a multi-engine aeroplane is to be used on the skill test
- Hold a valid Class 1 Medical Certificate
- Have completed, and successfully passed the Theoretical Knowledge requirements for CPL(A) or ATPL(A) as appropriate. The Theoretical Knowledge qualifications remain valid for 36 months from the date the last exam was passed
- Successful licence issue must take place within this period

How long does the course take to complete?

The Commercial Pilot Licence typically takes eight weeks to complete.

ADVANCED UPSET PREVENTION AND RECOVERY TRAINING

Advanced UPRT is required to better understand the cause and effect of aircraft upsets and equips you with the skills to identify, act and mitigate aircraft upset.

What are the pre-entry requirements?

- Be the holder of a PPL(A), CPL(A) or ATPL(A), including the privileges to fly at night (applicants that do not hold a CPL must hold a Course Completion Certificate for the Basic Instrument Flight Module)
- Hold a current UK CAA Class 1 or 2 Medical Certificate
- Passed Theoretical Knowledge exams for the CPL(A) or ATPL(A)

How long does the course take to complete?

The UPRT typically takes 1 week to complete.

Where will I train?

Gloucestershire Airport, HQ of Skyborne Airline Academy.

INSTRUMENT RATING (IR)

An Instrument Rating is required for an individual to be able to fly with sole reference to flight instruments, making flying in cloud and other instances of reduced visibility achievable.

What are the pre-entry requirements?

- Hold a PPL(A) or a CPL(A)
- Have the privilege to fly at night issued in accordance with current legislation and current UK CAA publications.

How long does the course take to complete?

The Instrument Rating typically takes six weeks to complete.

Where will I train?

Gloucestershire Airport, HQ of Skyborne Airline Academy.

AIRLINE PILOT STANDARDS MULTI-CREW COOPERATION COURSE (APSMCC)

Skyborne's APSMCC course has been designed to exceed the regulatory requirements for airline standards in relation to MCC training. Delivered by airline Training Captains on our state-of-the-art B737 MAX FTD.

What are the pre-entry requirements?

Hold a CPL(A) and Multi-Engine IR(A) and have completed the Theoretical Knowledge instruction for the CPL(A) or ATPL(A).

How long does the course take to complete?

The Multi-Crew Cooperation typically takes three weeks to complete.

Where will I train?

Gloucestershire Airport, HQ of Skyborne Airline Academy.

What aircraft type will I train on?

The B737 MAX FTD.
