Shopping

The Eden Centre is right next to the University campus, with over 100 shops including high-end & high-street fashion and a host of dining and leisure experiences including a multiplex cinema and bowling centre.

There are also a growing number of funky independent shops like the Craft Coop, featuring the work of local artists, and Ruby Moon, which “celebrates the unusual”!

High Wycombe also has the old town quarter which hosts a lively street market three times a week with a whole array of small street food vendors catering for every possible taste and budget.

Restaurants, bars and cafés

As well as the usual big chains – Wagamama’s, Pizza Express, Bill’s – High Wycombe boasts a whole host of smaller artisan restaurants, bars and coffee shops.

Mad Squirrel combines a local brewery and tap room with the best wood fired pizzas in town. Lata Lata, right outside the University, is the place for cocktails, small dishes and a laid-back vibe.

Fancy something spicy? Kapaad is renowned for it’s amazing southern Indian cuisine but there is no shortage of alternatives serving late into the night.

The American Smoke House Blue Grass serves huge portions of bbq, burgers and dirty fries all day for really low prices.

If coffee is your thing then High Wycombe really is your town – and it’s not just the high street chains. Local independents have a strong presence from Hatch Coffee, The Vanilla Pod Café Patisserie and The Front Room all getting our vote. Great relaxed places to hang out for lunch and a smoothie.





UXBRIDGE






AYLESBURY

Deciding where you are going to be living at university is a big choice. You may decide to stay living at home and commute – many of our students do, so you won't be alone.


But for others, moving away from home is a big part of their university experience, and you'll want the certainty of knowing where you are going to live.

Brook Street

Brook Street is our budget option and generally agreed to be our friendliest accommodation. Whilst some students are worried about the shared facilities initially, after a couple of days the great atmosphere on-site more than makes up for it. And of course, being the budget option means that you have much more money to spend on fun stuff.

Windsor House

Windsor House is right in the centre of High Wycombe and again just a five-minute walk from campus so excellent for those likely to sleep in – you can be up and in your lecture in record time!

Rooms are en suite, share a kitchen-diner with a comfy sofa, and there are six bedrooms per flat. We also have studio rooms with a built-in kitchenette if you want to get really fancy. All rooms have a WiFi and Ethernet internet connection.

The rooms in Windsor House have small double beds and everything else you need for your student life, desk, chair, wardrobe, chest of drawers and plenty of plug sockets. The kitchen-diners have soft seating areas and tables and chairs to sit down and eat together, play cards or just hang out.

What do our students like about Windsor House? Apart from the social nature of the halls, it is right in the centre of town, next door to a huge Primark and opposite a KFC, Pepes' Piri Piri and Subway so you can save a fortune on Deliveroo.

Hughenden Park Student Village

Hughenden Park Student Village has the best views across High Wycombe and is our biggest halls of residence. Our students love the atmosphere that this generates whilst still being grateful that the rooms are well sound proofed when they need peace and quiet.

Hughenden is a great mix of being able to have a nice space to yourself, with well laid out, spacious rooms, and also being social, as one of our current students says:

“Your kitchen is really big so there's plenty of room for get togethers or just for pushing the table back, filling the floor with your duvets and sticking on a movie.”

Hughenden is about 15 to 20 minutes' walk away from campus, with six en suite rooms with small double beds, and a shared kitchen diner per flat. We also have studio rooms with a built-in kitchenette. All rooms have a WiFi and Ethernet internet connection.

Whilst things like kettles, fridges, ovens and microwaves are provided in all the halls, you will need to bring your own cups, plates, cutlery, utensils, washing-up materials and tea towels as these are not provided. And you will have to do your own washing-up!

And with 24 hour security, controlled access and our staff always on-site, you will always be safe and secure in your university accommodation.



MONEY MATTERS

Starting your university journey may seem financially daunting, but there are many schemes to help you with funding your next steps to a successful career.

Tuition fee loans

The most common way to fund your degree is with a student loan that covers all your tuition fees - and you won't be asked to pay back a penny until you've graduated and earning over the government threshold. Find out more at [gov.uk/student-finance](https://www.gov.uk/student-finance).

Maintenance loans

You may be eligible for financial support from the government to help you with the cost of living during your studies. Contact our student centre or visit [gov.uk/student-finance](https://www.gov.uk/student-finance) for more information.

You can apply for both of these loans from February before you start university and the earlier the better to ensure that you are paid on time in September. You don't need to have made your final choice of university to apply – just put your first choice and you can edit your application at any point up to enrolment.

There may be additional bursaries, scholarships and benefits that you are able to claim depending on your personal circumstances. 





What we're looking for

We require GCSE Maths and English Language qualifications at grade 4/C or above (or equivalent qualifications such as Functional Skills Level 2) for some of our subjects.

When we assess your application, we'll be looking at more than just your qualifications. We're as interested in your ability, potential and passion for the subject you want to study.

Making you an offer

We base all our undergraduate full-time offers on the UCAS tariff table. You can find the preferred amount of points, and any specific subject requirements, in the course pages of this prospectus.

Tariff points examples

Student A

Studied A-level and achieved 3 A-level results Grade B (40 points) a grade C (32 points) and a grade D (24 points) total points = 96 tariff points.

Student B

Studied 1x A-level and a BTEC Diploma achieving grades of C (32 points) and grade MMM (96 points) total points = 128 tariff points.

International entry requirements

We accept a wide range of international academic qualifications for entry to our undergraduate courses, providing that they are equivalent to our entry requirements. You can find more information on the country-specific sections of our website at bucks.ac.uk/international.

English language requirements

You will need to prove a good standard of English to study at Buckinghamshire New University if you're not from a majority English-speaking country. We prefer the IELTS English language qualification (ielts.org). All applicants requiring a Student Route visa must demonstrate their ability to understand and communicate in both written and spoken English to satisfy UK Visa and Immigration (UKVI) regulations. Competence will be measured across four areas: reading, writing, speaking and listening. A list of acceptable qualifications can be found at bucks.ac.uk/english.

HOW TO APPLY



If you're ready to take the next step to study at Buckinghamshire New University, here's all the information you'll need to make your application.

For full-time undergraduate degrees, degrees with a foundation year and foundation courses, you need to apply through the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS).

Please apply directly to us for part-time study options, and our Diploma in Foundation Studies; Art, Design and Media course.

UCAS has a range of comprehensive guidance notes to help you through every step of the process at ucas.com/apply. When you complete your UCAS form, please use our UCAS code: **BUCKS B94**.

Your personal statement is an important element of your application form. It's your opportunity to tell us more about yourself and outline the reasons you want to study your chosen course.

You'll need one valid current reference for the majority of courses, although some do require two. Please make sure that your application is fully completed before you submit it to UCAS as an incomplete application may not be accepted.

Please ensure that you're aware of - and stick to - all the UCAS deadlines for responding to offers. We don't want you to miss out on any offers we make to you!

Independent applicants in the UK

If you're not applying through a school or college, you can consult careers organisations such as the National Careers Service. You should then submit your completed application online to UCAS, including the correct application fee, and attach your academic references.

International applicants outside the UK

If your school or college is registered with UCAS, they will help you to apply. Otherwise, please apply independently at ucas.com. Advice should be available from British Council offices as well as your school or college. You'll need to pay the correct application fee and obtain your academic references.

Students with a disability

We encourage all disabled students to disclose their disabilities on their UCAS form. This information is treated confidentially. We only use what you tell us to ensure we can support your needs if you come to study at the University.

HOW WE PROCESS YOUR APPLICATION

Once we receive your application

We'll check your application to make sure it's fully completed and that you meet the entry requirements. We will also look at your academic record, references and personal statement. If we need any further information, such as copies of your passport or qualifications, we'll email you so we can get your application processed.

Interviews and auditions

For some courses, you'll be invited to attend an interview and/or audition as part of the selection process. It's important that you keep an eye on UCAS Track and your emails so you don't miss our invitation.

Making an offer

We issue all offers by email or letter. The outcome of your application will also be communicated via UCAS Track.

Conditional offers: we'll offer you a place on the condition that you meet certain criteria, which is usually your exam results.

Accepting our offer

Once you've received a decision from all the universities to which you've applied, you must select a firm (first choice) and insurance (second choice).

UCAS will tell you the deadline by which you need to respond. It's important you meet this deadline or UCAS will assume you no longer want to hold those offers and will decline them on your behalf.

Course options to match your ambitions

The course portfolio is varied, but with all courses providing springboards towards a choice of rewarding careers.

If you have a strong and broad interest in computers, gadgets and technology, then Computing would be a good choice for you and prepare you for the next era of technological innovations. 

Explore crime's impact on society

If you're curious about why crime happens and want to delve into the inner workings of crime and criminal justice in contemporary societies, then you should think about our Criminology courses. You can focus purely on Criminology, or take one of our joint honours programmes in Criminology and Law; Criminology and Social Studies or Criminology and Forensic Studies.

All of these options let you look at the latest research in this fascinating area, and help you secure a career within a growing employment area.

You could look for jobs within and around the criminal justice system such as in prisons or the probation service. How about in government? Add some legal knowledge and you'll have even more options in the criminal justice system or the wider public sector.

A current new approach to crime involves the study and use of forensics within the criminal justice process. If this is your area of interest you should consider our new degree.

Some work with outside agencies so you'll learn from people actively involved in the topics you'll be studying, giving you real-world insight. We also offer you the option of taking a second year module in which you volunteer with an organisation related to your degree and work on your CV building skills at the same time.

We also bring in guest speakers to talk about their work. You'll even get a chance to explore the criminological world outside the classroom yourself. Past trips have included conferences, courts and prisons.

All this exposure to the wider working world means you'll be ready to jump straight into your career. Our courses develop your professional and personal skills, making you a highly employable graduate. We'll support you during your time with us and help you find a job after you finish.

Politics and International Relations

We live in a world where societies and the politics governing them are rapidly changing. If you want a career in which you help achieve social change, you might want to consider our exciting new Politics and International Relations programme. 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MIDWIFERY



Our aim at Buckinghamshire New University is to produce midwives that at the point of registration are not only safe and effective, but compassionate and skilled autonomous practitioners, with advocacy at the heart of practice. So, if you're looking for a degree that will equip you with the skills to become a well-rounded midwife, our course is for you.

Each birth is a unique experience for mother and baby, but midwifery is about so much more than just delivering babies. It is about the professional care of women – before, during, and after the birth of their child; helping to keep women and newborns safe and comfortable during this intimate and life changing experience.

If you have the compassion, care and courage needed, a degree in midwifery will teach you everything you need to know.

Midwives work alongside a wide range of professionals ensuring that safe compassionate care of women, newborns and families is at the heart of maternity provision.

Our curriculum has been developed in conjunction with partner trusts and service users to develop the Future Midwife and Continuity of Care and Carer national model. Upon completion of the course you will gain professional registration to the Nursing and Midwifery Council.



When studying with us, your education will be delivered locally, and you will also complete a local placement. Not only does this give you an opportunity to live and stay local whilst studying, but it also ensures you will be highly employable upon graduation by the trust where you train. Opportunities for employability across the rest of the UK will also be available due to a current high demand for midwives across the sector.

50% of your time on the course will be spent on a clinical placement and local trusts will provide you with placement areas in a wide range of maternity services. On your local placement with a trust partner, you will gain exposure to a diverse demographic of women, partners and families. You will cover the entire continuum of care, preparing you for the Continuity of Care and Carer model currently being implemented nationally. You will also become skilled in caring for women with and without additional needs and will work in partnership with women, enabling their views, preferences and decisions, helping to strengthen your capabilities.

Facilities

The course will be taught out of both Aylesbury and Uxbridge campuses, with access to excellent simulation suites on both sites. This includes up-to-date equipment allowing for the simulation of midwifery skills to enable the learner to develop in a safe environment. Our spaces reflect varying maternity settings, including a home birth environment and also ward areas.

They might even be on the panel when you come in for an interview to study with us.

We also support initiatives that boost your skills and add extra value to your course. For example, the ALERT programme (Acute Life-Threatening Events Recognition and Treatment) helps healthcare staff to recognise 'at risk' patients early on. ALERT is not offered as standard on most other nursing degree programmes, and we were proud to be the first university in England to introduce it into our curriculum.

Until you've got some experience under your belt, you won't be working with real patients but SimMan is the next best thing. A highly realistic manikin, he displays different symptoms, bodily functions and reacts to your care.

Our simulation suites look exactly like a hospital, and operating department, to give you confidence in the surroundings. This means you'll also find a range of industry-standard equipment including anesthesia machines, a defibrillator and surgical instruments.

As part of this course you'll complete placements to prepare you for your career with one of our many NHS partner trust across the Thames Valley area and beyond.

Life after University

You won't be short of opportunities when you leave as the demand for graduates with this qualification is high. Up and down the country, hospitals need Operating Department Practitioners, registered with the Health and Care Professions Council, to fill a range of roles.

Our graduates join operating theatre teams and undertake roles in trauma teams, intensive care units, accident and emergency departments, and more. Others continue their studies to complete further qualifications or decide to make an impact through research.





PARAMEDIC SCIENCE



As a paramedic, you need to be calm under pressure and ready to work methodically, either alone or as part of a team, to provide outstanding care to patients in a range of different settings. At Buckinghamshire New University, we will give you the knowledge, practical experience and clinical capabilities needed to provide that outstanding care in a range of clinical roles.

Paramedics work with other ambulance professionals, the emergency services, hospital teams and primary care to provide care to people experiencing a wide range of illnesses, injuries and other health and social care needs. Everyone in the team plays a critical role in making sure that patients receive the best possible outcome, which can often be in very complex circumstances.

Importantly, it's not just life-threatening emergencies - a large proportion of people cared for by paramedics have minor health complaints, long-term conditions or need social support through a difficult time in their life. We have designed this course to provide you with the capability to look after the range of patients you will encounter, which includes emergency situations and life-saving procedures as well as clinical examination, decision making and reasoning, care planning and referral to other services.

You will spend most of your practice-based learning hours on frontline emergency ambulances responding to 111 and 999 calls in the community. Alongside those ambulance placements, you will also spend time in other health and social care settings, such as the emergency department, maternity units and general practice, to further develop your clinical capabilities. To make sure that you are fully prepared and can be effective on clinical placements, our course includes a significant amount of practical teaching and clinical simulation to develop your practical ability and confidence prior to working with real patients under the supervision of your practice educators.



Our BA (Hons) Performing Arts (Film, TV and Stage) programme enables students to develop skills across a range of different media as well as performing for stage and screen. Your next step could be to create and perform in major theatrical productions, on film and radio, or staging and screening work in local and national venues. If you'd wish to focus more on acting, then our BA (Hons) Acting (Film, TV & Stage) allows students to develop the skills required to build your craft as an actor. You will also engage in acting across different platforms developing skills for film, television and stage.

Whether studying Performing Arts or Acting, you will also develop expertise in analysing how performances, films and radio productions create meaning in an increasingly technology-driven world.



Lights, camera, action

With London's theatre world only a short train journey away, we are perfectly placed for acting, performing arts and dance. It also means we can bring in industry professionals to run a range of masterclasses in dance, theatre, film and radio.

We have leading facilities at our High Wycombe Campus. Our Human Performance Laboratory, designed to increase performance through improved technique, has a three-lane running track with 3D motion capture. We also have professional recording studios for radio, film and TV production, plus dedicated workshops, studios, cameras and video equipment.

Our performing arts students get to be involved in a range of projects. In the past, students have helped devise theatrical productions with companies like Paper Birds, Station House Opera and dreamthinkspeak. Others have joined the National Youth Theatre and performed at the National Student Drama Festival.

Throughout your studies, you'll also have the chance to collaborate on exciting projects with students from our film and TV production, creative advertising, production design, and audio and music courses.

Breaking into the industry

Because our courses cover such a wide range of topics and skills, you'll have plenty of career choices when you graduate.

Our dance graduates work as performers, fitness and dance instructors, dance captains, choreographers and personal trainers. The career paths for our drama graduates include working in the acting profession, such as the National Theatre, and the TV and film industries. POLICING

Our BSc (Hons) Police Studies with Criminal Investigation programme is aimed at students who are seeking a broader study of policing beyond the police constable role as they may also be considering the many non-warranted roles both within policing or the wider criminal justice and security environment. This degree will help you to take an informed decision about your future career destination, offering a broader examination of policing and related activities rather than a specific focus on preparing you for a police officer career. Applicants should be aware that graduates who complete this degree and successfully apply to become police constables will have to undertake a graduate conversion programme during their initial police officer training. If you don't quite meet our entry requirements, then our optional foundation level year is a great way to develop the skills you'll need to complete this degree.

At Buckinghamshire New University, our programmes are operationally focused and geared towards employability. We have excellent links to serving police officers and staff, who we invite to share their knowledge and experience with our students. We help our students prepare for their future careers, developing their academic writing, research and study skills backed up with advice from our careers team.

PSYCHOLOGY



Ready to explore the mysteries of the mind? Want to understand criminal behaviour, counsel people through tough times, or take the first step towards clinical training? Don't worry if you're not sure what area interests you just yet. At Buckinghamshire New University, we have a psychology course to suit you.

Absolutely fascinating. That's how we'd describe psychology. Through theory and research, it unravels an enormous range of complex challenges to explain behaviour and how our brains work.

With input from industry employers, we've designed our psychology courses to help you develop the skills you need for an array of exciting careers in the public, private and voluntary sectors.

Learning in the lab


Think you'll always be in the lecture theatre? Think again. As well as listening to our experts, you'll join smaller groups in labs and seminars to discuss different topics.

You'll also spend time in our observation suite and psychology laboratory using specialist equipment such as Biopac[®] to measure different physiological responses, Tobii eye tracking equipment and HTC Vive virtual reality software.

We also arrange trips to places like prisons and courts to give you insights into different career paths. You'll see psychology in action and how your knowledge can be used in the real world.

When it's time to concentrate on completing assessments, our library is the perfect place to find the resources you need and a quiet place to study. Or, if you'd rather work off campus, e-journals and resources are only a few clicks away using our Virtual Learning Environment.



Your psychology career

Whether you just want to look at the subject as a whole, or specialise in a particular area, we have the course for you at Buckinghamshire New University. You can use our degrees as a launch pad into a variety of careers in the field.

You don't even need to have studied psychology before. We've designed courses that help you get up to speed with the theory behind the subject and the latest thinking in the field.

All our psychology degrees cover the core areas of psychology are accredited by the British Psychological Society (BPS), the representative body for psychology and psychologists in the UK.

After you finish your degree (if you achieve a 2:2 or higher), you'll be eligible for the Graduate Basis for Chartered Membership of the BPS. This is the first step towards becoming a chartered psychologist.

Which course is for you?

Our BSc (Hons) in Psychology offers a fantastic introduction to different areas in the field. From social psychology to research methods, this course provides you with an overview of the core areas of psychology. You'll have the opportunity to choose modules that interest you in your final year.

With Sports Psychology, you'll be well versed in the techniques and skills required to understand how sports people can achieve their full potential. You'll acquire the knowledge and skills so you can understand the unique psychological issues influencing an athlete's preparation and performance.

Alternatively, you might be motivated to explore criminal minds. Pick from our Psychology and Criminology or Criminological Psychology degrees. Both courses focus on forensic psychology, victimology and psychology in the criminal justice system.

Psychology and Criminology is a joint honours degree, allowing you to study Psychology and Criminology as two distinct areas. Criminological Psychology, on the other hand, takes a psychological approach to understanding the impact of criminal behaviour and the justice system.

Visiting industry professionals will bring the theories you learn to life during your studies. They'll also share their expertise on current practices. That's really valuable in a field that's always evolving. As you get towards the end of your course, they'll also give you advice on how to prepare for working life.





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
